Who is the course for?

If you are working in the industry and aspire to a career as a manager this course is ideal for you. Entry requirements

One of the following qualifications:

- BTEC National Certificate/Diploma
- Access to HE Diploma
- 1 A Level or 2 AS Levels

The Foundation Degree in Hospitality Management does not include a work placement. All applicants must be working within the hospitality sector with exception of those applicants coming from overseas.

Applicants from overseas studying this programme are supported by their tutor and the International Centre in finding part-time work, in the first year, as this is a suitable way for students to draw from their experience and sustain working knowledge. Work is limited to part time hours and is undertaken in the student's own time.

Mature students not meeting the entry criteria are encouraged to apply and will be considered on the basis of relevant work experience, passing the course entrance assessment and successful interview.

FdA Hospitality Management

If your first language is not English, you should have a minimum score of 6.0 in IELTS alongside a UK or equivalent international qualification. Application will be required to attend a College interview and may need to complete an assessment test.

Assessment methods

Each module carries a number of assessments. Depending on the module you will be assessed through combinations of the following: formal reports, presentations, exams, in-class tests, E-portfolios and case studies. Work-based modules will also be assessed through work-based tasks, logbooks and reflective statements undertaken in the work place.

Employer involvement

This new FdA programme will have an emphasis on work-based learning and assessment, therefore all applicants must have secured a position within the hospitality sector prior to the course commencing. Employer involvement is integrated within the delivery of the course programme through guest speakers, visits to employers and work-based assessment undertaken in the workplace.

What does validation mean?

Validation means that the partner university recognises and monitors the quality and standards of the programme and approves the qualification. The programme is managed within university regulations and on successful completion students will receive a qualification from the university.

Benefits of validation

- You can progress onto the final year of the BA (Hons) Hospitality Management Degree or BA (Hons) Professional Practice Degree at Middlesex University
- You will have the opportunity to visit the university campus during the first year of the FdA programme.

What progression routes are available?

You can progress onto the final year of a BA (Hons) Hospitality Management course or the BA (Hons) Professional Practice course at Middlesex University (subject to meeting course entry requirements).

Future career paths

On completion of this programme you will be well placed to develop a career in a variety of roles within the Hospitality sector, including: Hotel Receptionist, Hotel Manager, Accommodation Manager, Restaurant Manager and Events Organiser/Manager.
