### Who is the course designed for?

### Entry Requirements

One of the following qualifications:

- Advanced GNVQ

- Access Qualification

All applicants must be working within the hospitality sector with exception of those applicants coming from overseas. Those students will have to secure a position in the work place by the second semester with support and guidance provided by the Tutor and the International Office Work Placement team.

Mature students not meeting the entry criteria are encouraged to apply and will be considered on the basis of relevant work experience, passing the course entrance assessment and successful interview.

If your first language is not English, you should have a minimum score of 6.0 in IELTS alongside a UK or equivalent international qualification. Application will be required to attend a College interview and may need to complete an assessment test.

## FdA Hospitality Management\*

### Employer Involvement:

This new FdA programme will have an emphasis on work-based learning and assessment, therefore all applicants must have secured a position within the hospitality sector prior to the course commencing. Employer involvement is integrated within the delivery of the course programme through guest speakers, visits to employers and work-based assessment undertaken in the workplace.

### What progression routes are available?

After your FdA Hospitality Management, you will be well placed to work as a manager anywhere in the hospitality industry including domestic and international hotel companies, leisure parks, restaurants and public houses. Successful students can also continue their studies by entering the final year of a BA (Hons) Hospitality Management course or the BA (Hons) Professional Practice course offered at Middlesex University (subject to meeting course entry requirements).

### What form does the assessment take?

Assessment is an integral part of the overall learning process and our student centred approach aims to promote initiative and creativity, critical thinking, evaluation, decision making, personal reflection and effective communication skills.

Each module carries a number of assessments. Depending on the module you will be assessed through combinations of the following: formal reports, presentations, exams, in-class tests, E-portfolios and case studies. Work-based modules will also be assessed through work-based tasks, logbooks and reflective statements undertaken in the work place.

### How do I apply?

For the full time courses which include Foundation Degrees, Higher National Diplomas and Higher National Certificates you will need to apply through UCAS (our reference is E10), or complete an online application form on this website. We will give you advice and support you throughout the UCAS process once you have been offered a place.
